AMENDMENT (No. 3) 2001**

Amendment of Section 2.3 Travel Allowances, Allocations and Entitlements

After "(a) **Sittings of the Legislative Assembly or direct travel of the Member to or from such sittings;**"

Omit—

(b) *A meeting of a Parliamentary committee of which he/she is a Member or the Member's direct travel to or from such a meeting;*

(c) *Attendance at a function representing a Minister, the Speaker, Leader of the Opposition or Leader of other Party on official business as such office-bearer or direct travel to or from such a function;*

Insert—

(b) *A meeting of a Parliamentary committee, or attending a meeting, conference or seminar or other business relating to such a Parliamentary committee, of which he/she is a Member or the Member's direct travel to or from such an event;*

(c) *Attendance at a function, conference, meeting or seminar representing a Minister, the Speaker, Leader of the Opposition or Leader of other Party on official business as such office-bearer or direct travel to or from such an event;*

After "(e) **Attendance at official Government, Parliamentary or Vice-regal functions;**"

Omit—

(f) *Attending to business outside a Member's electorate directly relating to a Member's electorate;*

Insert—

(f) *Attending to business (including attending conferences, functions, meetings or seminars) outside a Member's Electorate, directly relating to a Member's Electorate;*

After "(i) **Attending to business related to the Member's current responsibilities as non-Government spokesperson for the Ministerial portfolio;**"

Omit—

(j) *Studies, investigations, or inquiries on matters related to a Member's duties and responsibilities as a Member of Parliament provided that the nature, official purpose, place and other relevant information is stated by the Member to identify the Parliamentary business involved and strictly approved in accordance with these recommendations; and*

Insert—

(j) *Studies, investigations, or inquiries on matters related to a Member's duties and responsibilities as a Member of Parliament (including addressing or attending conferences, meetings, functions or seminars) provided that the nature, official purpose, place and other relevant information is stated by the Member to identify the Parliamentary business involved and strictly approved in accordance with these guidelines; and*
