

# Queensland Children's Hospital

The Queensland Government will build a new children's hospital to provide world-class care for Queensland children. The Queensland Children's Hospital (QCH) will be a purpose-built, tertiary facility adjacent to the current Mater Children's Hospital site in South Brisbane. The QCH will consolidate the existing paediatric services of the Royal Children's Hospital, the Mater Children's Hospital and the Queensland Paediatric Cardiac Service at the Prince Charles Hospital.

On 12 June 2008, in accordance with sections 77 and 79 of the *State*

*Development and Public Works Organisation Act 1971*, the Governor in Council approved a regulation to declare the Queensland Children's Hospital State Development Area and the associated development scheme. This declaration will facilitate both the granting of necessary approvals and, if required, the acquisition of land, and will also simplify delivery of critical infrastructure required to support the QCH.

The Coordinator-General is responsible for approving material changes of use in a state development area.
