Page 31 Revised Content for “Cultural heritage” Section:

Native Title

The Commonwealth *Native Title Act 1993* recognises and protects native title. It establishes how dealings in land, water and natural resources that may affect native title should occur so that they are valid. In accordance with the *Native Title (Queensland) Act 1993*, there are two active native title claims within the study corridor. These claims have been made by the Turrbal People and the Yugara/YUgarapul People over broader areas covering Brisbane.

Cultural heritage

In accordance with the *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Act 2003*, Turrbal People are the Aboriginal Party for the study corridor. Previous investigations have identified a number of places with Aboriginal cultural heritage significance, in particular York’s Hollow (Victoria Park). The views of the Turrbal People will be important for determining Aboriginal cultural heritage significance within the study corridor.

There are several significant historic cultural heritage sites within the study corridor. These include sites listed on the *National Heritage List*, the *Queensland Heritage Register*, the *Brisbane City Plan 2000* Heritage Register, and the *Australian National Shipwreck Database*.
