# **\$50M FUNDING**

20+% year on year growth and course expansion necessitated expansion of sites for CQU Cairns operations.

Specialist facilities were required to expand into areas that could address specific regional skills shortages so in 2019 it became evident a new purpose built campus would be required.





## **PROJECT ADVOCACY FOCUSED ON A FEW CORE PRINCIPLES:**

Australians who live and work in regional areas, such as Cairns, make an enormous contribution to national wealth but also face economic and social challenges.

Higher education degree attainment in the regions is less than half the national average.

More than 55 per cent of those who are trained in the regions, stay on to establish careers and families.

To keep our best and brightest in the regions and to address regional skills shortages, we must provide courses and facilities that are attractive, world-class and accessible.

CQUniversity is a public university. A better bottom-line means improved resilience and more investment in the Cairns region.



#### **CURRENT STATE OF PLAY**

- Agreement with CRC for the land is in the final stages. Location of the land is the Cnr of Hartley and Grafton Streets. This has synergies with the Convention Centre and the development of a 'knowledge precinct'.
- Federal Government is undertaking a merit review to determine timings of funding release. Funding timelines will be announced in the October budget.
- Once the funding is received by CQU, project timelines will be updated and announced.
- Internal strategy and plans are being developed for delivery (contract type could range from GMP to D&C).
- Considering options for the contractor engagement which includes a potential EOI process to help reduce time once funding has been approved.
