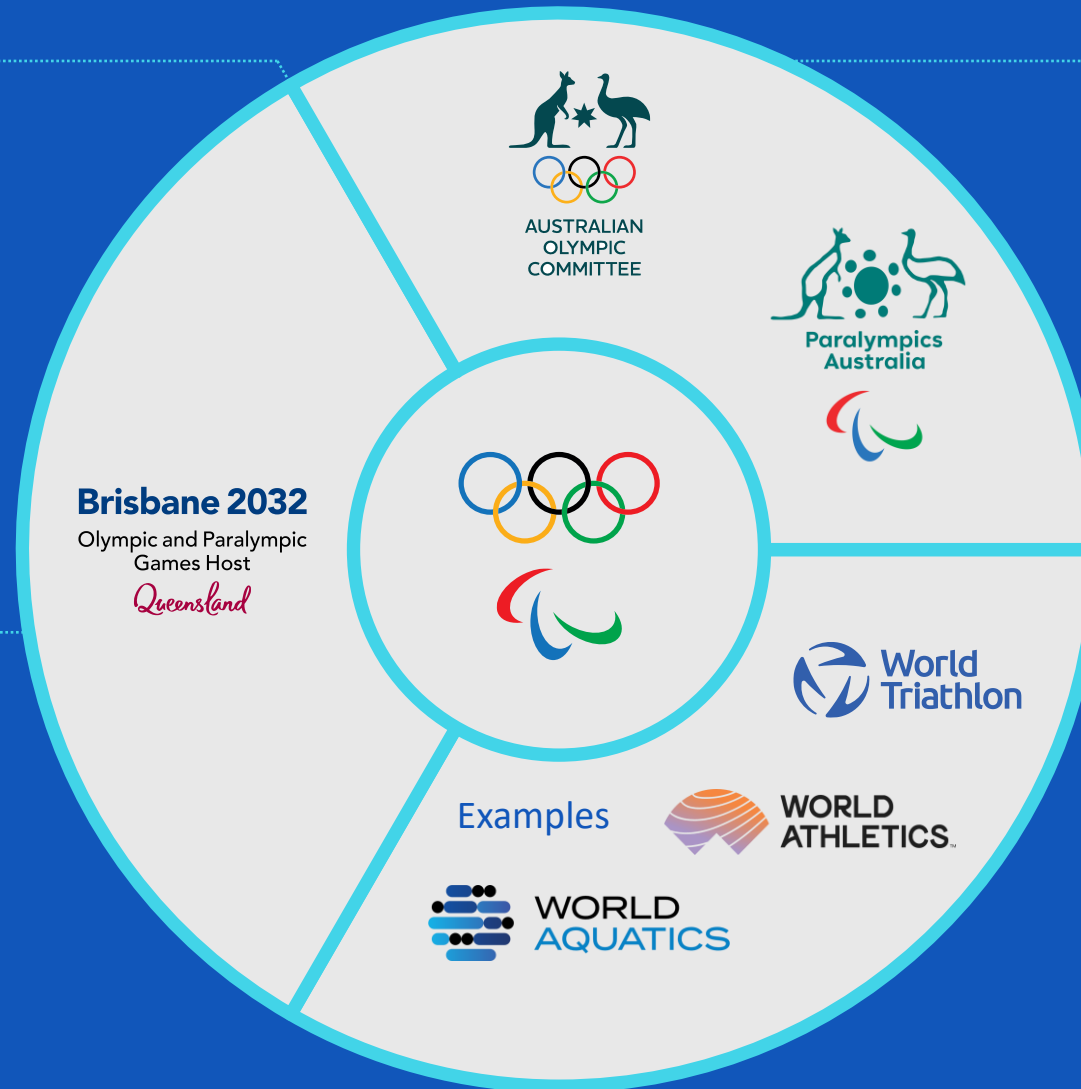
The Olympic and Paralympic Movements

International Olympic & Paralympic Committees

- International bodies governing the Olympic and Paralympic movements.
- Based in Lausanne, Switzerland and Bonn, Germany.
- IOC formed in 1894.
- IPC formed in 1989.

Local Organising Committees

- Temporary Organising Committee established in each Host Country when the Games is awarded.
- Manages the conduct and operation of that specific edition of the Games.



National Olympic & Paralympic Committees

- Bodies governing Olympic and Paralympic sport in a particular country.
- Responsible for managing the Olympic and Paralympic teams competing in the Games.
- 206 NOCs and 184 NPCs globally.

International Federations

- Govern a particular sport(s) globally.
- Oversee the delivery of their sport(s) at the Games.
- IOC recognises 35+ IFs and each sport at the Games is managed by an IF.
- Manage the rules, regulations, field of play for their sport.
