

Cairns Hospital Expansion Project - \$250m

- The Cairns Hospital Expansion Project aims to improve the use of existing infrastructure capacity at Cairns Hospital along with a new surgical centre and sub-acute capacity offsite.
- The opening of a subacute facility away from the hospital will include an extra 45 beds.
- 96 beds including:
 - 32 beds
 - 4 theatres and a surgical centre
 - 64 beds increased capacity
- An average of 232 FTE jobs (Around 611 total jobs) the total duration construction will be created, supporting the local economy.
 - 141 Beds
 - \$250m
 - Contractor: TBA



Atherton Hospital - \$74.8m


- The Clinical Services Building (CSB) will feature:
 - new ED
 - medical imaging
 - general ward
 - · maternity ward and birthing service
 - operating and endoscopy theatres.
- Façade finished, internal fitout ongoing.
- Construction on track for completion in late 2022 and operational first half of 2023.
- Refurbishment works to then proceed for Building 3, with expected completion late 2023.
- Community, Allied Health and Mental Health Building is fully operational and was completed in August 2020.
 - 56 beds
 - FKG Group
 - 80 construction jobs





Mental Health Unit - \$70m

- New three-storey building to form part of an expansion of Cairns Hospital.
- Part of an important upgrade of local acute mental health services.
- Demolition works are complete with construction now in progress.
- Works programmed for completion late 2023, site operational in 2024.
- Upcoming milestones include out-of-ground works commencing, internal fitout, roof placement
 - 53 beds, 5 more than previously, including a 10-bed Mental Health Intensive Care unit.
 - 70 nearly full-time construction jobs
 - Hutchinson Builders





Expansion of Cairns Hospital Emergency Department - \$26.4m

- Works include ED refurb spaces of resus bays and flow efficiencies. These works will follow completion of the fit-out of a nearby shell space, vacated store area.
- Already complete are the Transit Procedure Unit and the Minor Procedure Unit, both designed to relieve ED pressure.
- On track for completion in late 2023.
- Principal contractor is WATPAC.





Cairns youth residential rehabilitation and treatment service

- A new purpose-built youth drug rehabilitation centre in Edmonton with accommodation for 10 young people.
- Federal funding of \$51 million was allocated to build and deliver three new AOD facilities to three Health Services, one of which is CHHHS.
- Site acquisition completed in Edmonton
- Public consultation in progress.

Cow Bay Primary Health Centre

- Upgrade to Cow Bay Primary Health Centre into a modern health hub
- \$14.879m budget
- Current facility more than 20 years old and not originally built as a health facility.
- The clinic will be fitted out for emergencies along with better clinical spaces for visiting specialists.





Major works at Cairns Hospital

- \$13 million High Voltage Upgrade across
 A, B, C and D blocks of the hospital
 - WATPAC are the principal contractors
 - Project commenced Oct 2020.
 Estimated practical completion date of 2023.
- \$8.5 million chiller replacement at B Block
 - WATPAC are the principal contractors
 - Project commenced late 2021.
 Estimated practical completion date of 2023.
