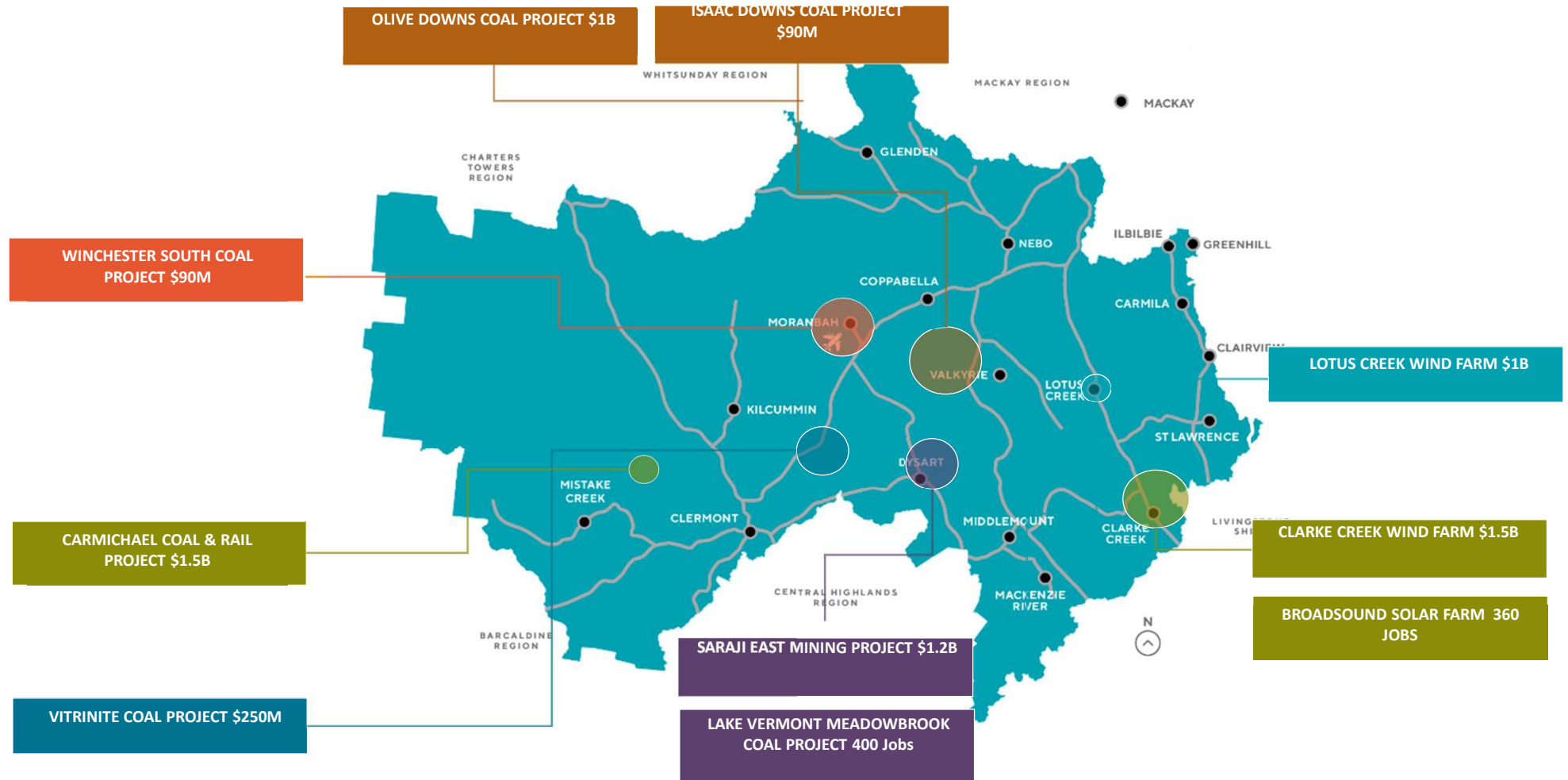

Resource and Renewable Projects



Current Energy Generation in the Region

Solar Energy

- 3 operating solar farms generating 191.5 MW of electricity.
- 1 solar farm under construction with a capacity of 392 MW.
- 10 approved solar farms (or extensions) not yet under construction with a total capacity of 1,365 MW.

Wind Energy

- 1 wind farm under construction with a capacity of 450 MW.
- 2 approved wind farms not yet under construction with a total capacity of 741 MW.
- 1 announced wind farm with no approvals yet, expected to generate 70 MW.



Potential Energy Generation in the Region

- The region currently produces 191.5 MW of electricity, enough to power approximately 112,500 homes.
- If all approved or under-construction projects are completed, the region could produce 2,637 MW of electricity, enough to power approximately 1,549,237 homes.

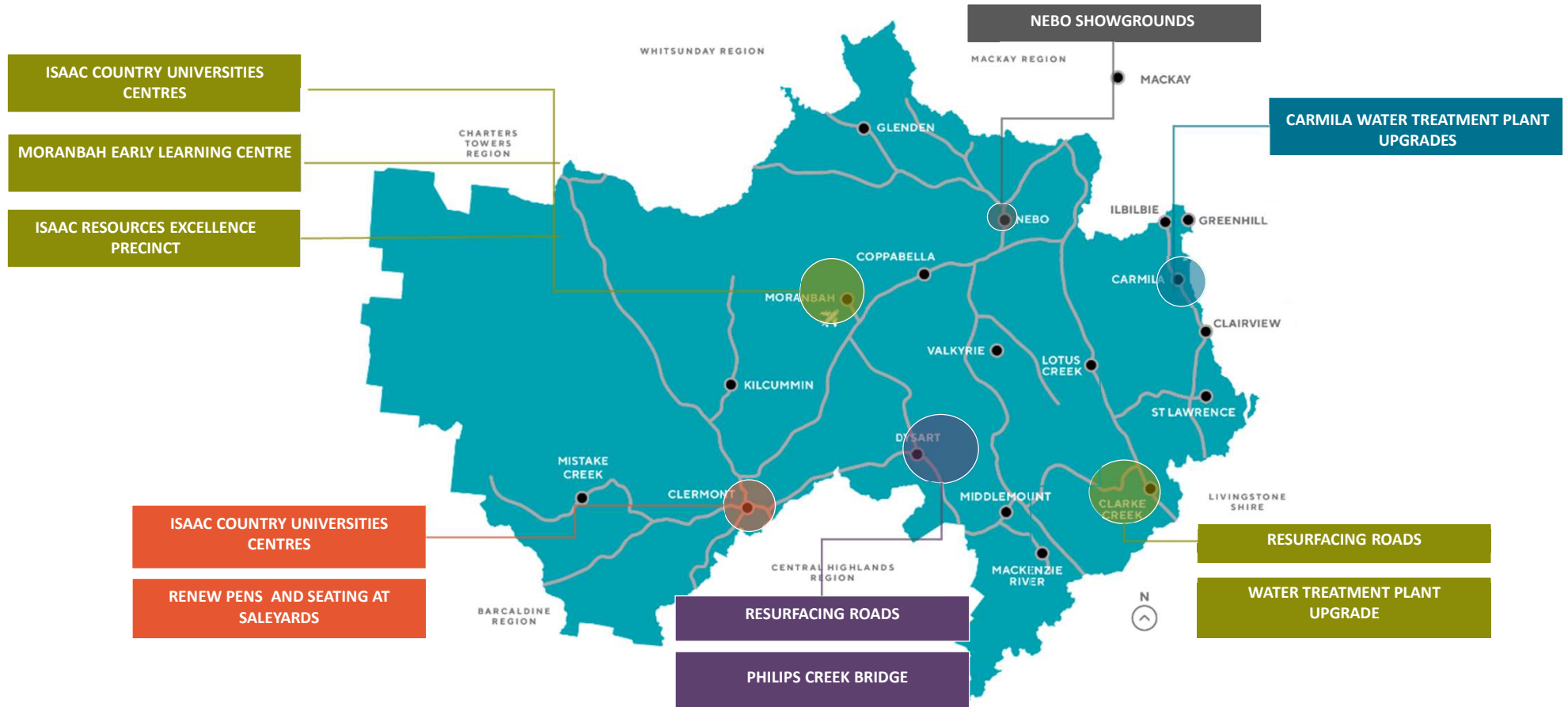

Our Projects: Phillips Creek Bridge Replacement

\$18 million in total, **\$14.6 million** allocated this financial year. Project set to be completed January 2026.

This project is funded by the Australian and Queensland Governments in association with Isaac Regional Council.



Our Projects: Isaac Resources Excellence Precinct

\$41.7 million investment from the Australian and Queensland governments, with **\$10.2 million** allocated this financial year to start early infrastructure works.

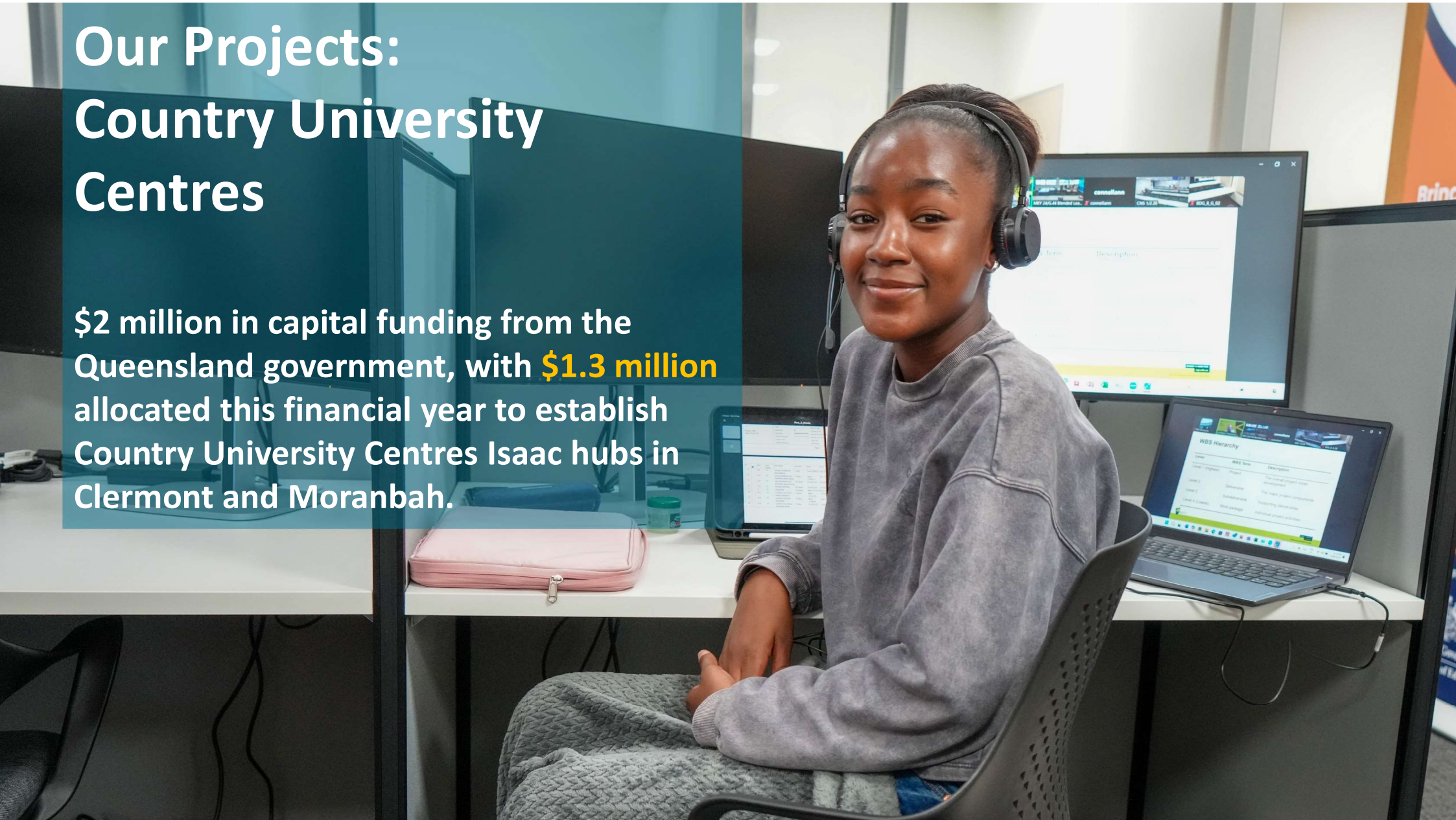
This will be a hub for training, technology, innovation, sustainability and economic development.

Our Projects: Country University Centres

\$2 million in capital funding from the Queensland government, with **\$1.3 million** allocated this financial year to establish Country University Centres Isaac hubs in Clermont and Moranbah.



Our Projects: Nebo Showgrounds Master Plan

\$2.8 million in partnership with the Australian government, with **\$1.1 million** allocated this financial year to deliver primary infrastructure upgrades, heavy vehicle access, general camping upgrades and car parking.



Other Council Projects FY 25/26

Roads infrastructure

- \$3.85 million resurfacing 119 km of sealed roads
- \$3.7 million upgrades to Moranbah Goonyella Road Intersection (Australian Government and developer funded)
- \$3.46 million re-sheet 35.6 km of unsealed gravel roads
- \$1 million sealed road rehabilitation at Ken Logan Road, Valkyrie Road, Saraji Road, and Peak Downs Mine Road

Community infrastructure

- \$800,000 for the \$1.6 million Moranbah Early Learning Centre expansion and renovation in partnership with the Queensland Government.
- \$300,000 to begin replacing of air- conditioning in Nebo Memorial Hall
- \$300,000 selling pens and bull ring seating renewal at J.R. Turner Saleyards in Clermont
- \$45,000 replacement of public access computers in Isaac Libraries

Water and waste

- \$1.76 million St Lawrence Water Treatment Plant upgrade (multi-year project)
- \$1.2 million sewer relining and repairs
- \$1.12 million Carmila Water Treatment Plant upgrade (multi-year project)
- \$487,000 repurpose the Dysart Waste Management Facility into a transfer station (multi-year project)
- \$99,000 install water line for firefighting at Moranbah Waste Management Facility
